A home occupation permit empowers those who are engaged in small commercial ventures that could not necessarily be sustained if it were necessary to lease commercial quarters or which, by the nature of the venture, are appropriate in scale and impact to be operated within a residence. Home occupations are encouraged for their contribution to reducing the number of vehicle trips often generated by conventional businesses. They are permitted in all residential units located in residential zones. A property owner or designated representative may apply for a home occupation permit by filing an application with the Planning Department.

Home Occupation Review Criteria

Appearance of Residence

1. The home occupation shall be restricted to lawfully-built enclosed structures and be conducted in such a manner as not to give an outward appearance of a business.

The home will not show signs of a business outside of the home. It will continue to be a family residence.

2. The home occupation shall not result in any structural alterations or additions to a structure that will change its primary use or building code occupancy classification.

Nothing structurally will be changed.

3. The home occupation shall not violate any conditions of development approval (i.e., prior development permit approval).

The home will not violate and conditions of development approval.

4. No products and or equipment produced or used by the home occupation may be displayed to be visible from outside any structure.

The outside of the home will continue to be used as normal.

Storage

1. Outside storage, visible from the public right-of-way or adjacent properties, is prohibited.

There will be no outside storage for the business in the home.

2. On-site storage of hazardous materials (including toxic, explosive, noxious, combustible, or flammable) beyond those normally incidental to residential use is prohibited.

There will be no storage of hazardous materials.

3. Storage of inventory or products and all other equipment, fixtures, and activities associated with the home occupation shall be allowed in any structure.

This is correct.

Employees

1. There shall be no outside paid employees.

There will no outside employees.

2. Additional individuals may be employed by or associated with the home occupation, so long as they do not report to work or pick up/deliver at the home.

No one other than myself will be working in the home.

3. The home occupation site shall not be used as a headquarters for the assembly of employees for instruction or other purposes, including dispatch to other locations.

The home will not be used as a headquarters.

Advertising and Signs

1. Signs shall comply with Chapter 16.144. In no case shall a sign exceed the residential district standard of four square feet.

There will be no signs that exceed the residential standard of four square feet.

Vehicles, Parking and Traffic

1. One commercially-licensed vehicle associated with the home occupation is allowed at the home occupation site. It shall be of a size that would not overhang into the public right-of-way when parked in the driveway or other location on the home occupation site.
There will be no commercially-licensed vehicles.

2. There shall be no more than three commercial vehicle deliveries to or from the home occupation site daily. There shall be no commercial vehicle deliveries during the hours of 9:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m.
There will be no more than three commercial vehicles delivering to the home daily.

3. There shall be no more than one client's or customer's vehicle at any one time and no more than eight per day at the home occupation site.
Customer vehicles will comply.

Business Hours

1. There shall be no restriction on business hours, except that clients or customers are permitted at the home occupation from 7:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m.
Customer vehicles will comply.

Prohibited Home Occupation Uses

1. Any activity that produces radio or TV interference, noise, glare, vibration, smoke or odor beyond allowable levels as determined by local, state or federal standards, or that can be detected beyond the property line is prohibited.
There will be no activities of the nature.

2. Any activity involving on-site retail sales is prohibited, except that the sale of items that are incidental to a permitted home occupation is allowed. For example, the sale of lesson books or sheet music from music teachers, art or craft supplies from arts or crafts instructors, computer software from computer consultants, and similar incidental items for sale by home businesses are allowed.

There will be no on-site retail sales.

3. Any uses described in this section or uses with similar objectionable impacts because of motor vehicle traffic, noise, glare, odor, dust, smoke, or vibration, such as: ambulance service; animal hospital, veterinary services, kennels, or animal boarding; auto and other vehicle repair, including auto painting; or repair, reconditioning, or storage of motorized vehicles, boats, recreational vehicles, airplanes, or large equipment on-site.

The business will comply.

This application will not be officially accepted until department staff have determined that the application is filled out and signed, the application fee has been paid, and the submittal requirements have been met.
